"go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted -Matthew 28:10b, 17



The Garden Tomb is a rock-cut tomb in Jerusalem, which was unearthed in 1867 and is considered by some Christians to be the site of the burial and resurrection of Jesus.

It is not difficult to believe that even when they saw the Risen Lord there were some who still doubted the reality of what was right before their eyes. The Resurrection defies everything we know about life and death. Yet, the Resurrection is central to our faith and life. Without the Resurrection we have a dead prophet. Because of the Resurrection we have forgiveness, salvation, and living hope.

As nice as that sounds it is still hard to grasp the reality of the event. The Gospel of Matthew records the story of the guards reporting that Jesus' disciples stole his body and therefore the Resurrection is a hoax. (Matthew 28:11-15). On the one hand it is perhaps easier to believe that the body was stolen, than that a dead person returned to life.

However, as Christ-followers we are committed to the reality of the Resurrection. Our entire theological system relies on the fundamental belief that Jesus died, was buried, and rose on the

third day. Scientifically, we cannot prove this. It is the basic tenet of our faith and its reality is supported by the witness of the apostles, who sacrificed their very lives rather than deny the reality of Jesus' Resurrection.

I recall a song that I heard as a young person growing up in church; "It's Real". The final words declare:

Then at last by faith I touched Him, and, like sparks from smitten steel, *Just so quick salvation reached me, oh, bless God, I know it's real!* The refrain says simply: But it's real, it's real; *Oh*, *I know it's real*: Praise God, the doubts are settled. For I know, I know it's real! (Homer L. Cox ca. 1907. Public domain)

Scholars have penned many books and great theological discourse taken place concerning the so -called "proofs" of the Resurrection. Let me suggest that the proof of the Resurrection is found in a transformed life. That is a life of discipleship, committing above all else to be a Christfollower. I assure you that all of the scholarly, or scientific, debate in the world cannot prove or disprove the reality of a physical resurrection from the dead. Equally, I assure you that all of the scholarly, or scientific debate, in the world cannot disprove the life of a disciple of Jesus the Christ. If you are looking for proof of the Resurrection look no farther than in the transformation and regeneration of your own life.
