When writing to the church at Philippi, Paul declared, this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus (Philippians 3:13-14).

It has been one year since we closed our doors to in person worship and learned to use technology to bring worship into our homes. We worshipped outside, when the weather permitted, which not only provided in person opportunities for socialization, but also gave a profound public witness to our faith in Jesus Christ. Over the course of the year, we tried reopening strategies to bring the family back into the home we love so much. At each step on this journey, we have struggled to balance our commitment to faith and worship with our commitment to protect all entrusted to our care. There has been a steep learning curve and we have stumbled along the way. With each faltering step we have picked ourselves up and continued to press on toward the goal of the heavenly call.

One unanticipated blessing of the current pandemic is our partnership with the Livingston County Health Department. Our facility has provided easy accessibility for hundreds of persons seeking the COVID-19 vaccine. In opening our doors to the community, we have functioned as the hands and feet of Christ for those seeking the vaccines. The professional staff and volunteers have been a joy to work with.

Growing from this partnership, and in consultation with public health officials, we feel comfortable lifting some of the restrictions that have affected worship. Accordingly, we are taking steps to open worship to a more familiar format.

On Easter Sunday, April 4, we will conduct two worship services. 8:00 am and 10:00 am. We are requesting that you make a reservation to attend one of these two services. This is the last time you will be asked to make a reservation to attend worship.

Moving forward the following guidelines will be in place:

- Beginning Sunday April 11, reservations will no longer be required.
- Effective Easter Sunday the ribbons will be removed from the pews and you will be invited to sit wherever you like.

- You are asked to sit only with family or with those persons with whom you travel to and from worship.
- If you are not sitting with family, or traveling companions please maintain at least three feet of social distance.
- All entry will continue to be through the gym. Exit through the main front door.
- Sanitize your hands prior to entering the sanctuary.
- Masks will be worn upon entering and leaving the sanctuary.
- If you choose to remove your mask, please be respectful of your sisters and brothers who choose to wear a mask and maintain social distance.

These guidelines will be reviewed periodically and adjusted according to the best information available. Our purpose has never been to restrict anyone's worship practices. Our sole aim is to maintain the safest possible worship environment for everyone.

Board of Ministries

The Board of Ministries met on Thursday, March 11, 2021.

Adult Ministries: The Ruth Circle has begun meeting again. When the church fully opens once again, there will be plans for a Women's Sunday and a mother/daughter tea.

Children's Ministries: ABK continues to meet. The Valentine's Day activities were a success. Volunteers are working on bags for Easter for the children. ABK will end with the school year in May.

Plans are being made for summer VBS.

Fellowship: In January we served 46 families, representing 138 people in our food pantry. In February we served 22 families with a total of 66 people. Gift certificates for Easter have been ordered from County Market.

Associate Pastor: New furniture has been installed in the youth room.

We have been meeting with high school aged students every other week with drop in nights. The group wants to plan a lock-in. The goal would be to have about twenty kids signed up ahead of time and then build on that core group.

Senior Pastor: Proposed changes to covid protocols moving forward. Eliminating the need for reservations after Easter, removing the tape from the pews, etc. Masks would still be worn on entering and leaving the sanctuary and the traffic flow will remain the same to limit crossing paths. As we move forward it is important that we do so safely and with the greatest respect for the health and welfare of everyone.

Suggested changing our mission statement from "growing the family of God" to words from Esther - "For such a time..." Telling the Story - "We proclaim Christ crucified" (1 Corinthians 1:23). Nurturing Disciples... "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19). Serving the Community... "The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28; Mark10:45). Committed to Prayer... "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Philippians 4:8).

What we do has to be surrounded by prayer.

We wish our entire church family a happy and healthy holiday weekend.




On-Line Giving
