

## How's Your Prayer Life . . .?

That question has been placed in front of us for the last four years. In a quest to strengthen our personal and corporate prayer life we have read books and written prayer journals; we have conducted prayer vigils and joined in prayer partnership teams. We have read it on the screen in worship and even had it printed on tee shirts.

I remain totally committed to the conviction that prayer is essential to our life in Christ. As such I will continue to ask the question and push us to ever-deeper experiences in prayer, both personal and corporate. I would like to suggest that it is now time to ask a second question: What Am I Doing for the Kingdom of God?

As vital as prayer is to our spiritual development there comes a time to rise from our knees, roll up our sleeves, and become actively engaged in ministry. If our prayers are to have power in the church and in the world at large they must become incarnational; that means that what we pray for must become flesh and blood in our daily lives. Prayer should inform and shape our lives, but our lives do not end with prayer-rather our life as disciples begins with prayer and moves into the realm of a broken world.

Let's briefly take a look at some biblical examples of Jesus in prayer.

In Mark nine the disciples of Jesus tried and failed to heal a child with a seizure disorder. When they asked Jesus why they had failed he responded, "This kind can come out only through prayer" (Mark 9:29).

Luke 6:12-13 records that Jesus spent a night in prayer prior to selecting the twelve disciples, whom he also named apostles.

On the night of his betrayal and arrest Jesus prayed fervently to be spared the cup that was to be set before him. His prayer was so intense that Luke records his sweat fell like drops of blood (Luke 22:40-46; cf. Matthew 26:36-44; Mark 14:32-39).

Mark 1:35-39 narrates that "In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed." When the disciples found Jesus and informed him that everyone was looking for him Jesus' response was "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so

that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do."

The point is this: *Jesus' actions were preceded and informed by prayer*. The child could not be healed without prayer, the selection of the Twelve was informed by a night in prayer; the ordeal of the cross was not accomplished without an anguished night of prayer; the inaugural preaching tour was launched following a quiet morning of personal prayer.

Having asked "How's Your Prayer Life"; it is now time to ask how we are going to incarnate our prayers into our daily life and ministry. Our church's website declares that First Baptist Church is "Growing the Family of God" by. . . Telling the Story, Nurturing Believers and Serving the Community.

Telling the Story refers to the evangelistic piece of sharing with other people the story of what God has done and is continuing to do in our lives. Telling the Story is about inviting people into a living, vital relationship with a loving, forgiving, nurturing Savior.

Nurturing believers is that portion of our ministry that provides opportunities for spiritual development through Bible study, small group activities, Sunday church school, daily vacation Bible school, youth and children's ministries, worship, prayer meetings, and other activities designed to promote personal spiritual development.

Serving the Community includes the food pantry, but it is much more than that. Serving the Community is discerning ministries that will promote social justice, feed the hungry, house the homeless and seek equality for all persons. Serving the Community includes many of the same activities that nurture believers such as children's and youth ministries and Bible school.

Each of these ministries needs to be preceded by and informed by prayer. *Prayer requires a corresponding and related action*. As we have seen in the examples of Jesus. Prayer preceded action. Action was empowered by prayer.

It is time for our prayers to go into action. The Word must become flesh in our lives, in our church, and in our community. Otherwise we are of all people to be most pitied.

Therefore, I ask each of us again: What Am I Doing for the Kingdom of God?
