Oswald Chambers wrote: "When God gets us alone through suffering, heartbreak, temptation, disappointment, sickness, or by thwarted desires, a broken friendship, or a new friendship - when He gets us absolutely alone, and we are totally speechless, unable to ask even one question, then He begins to teach us" (My Utmost for His Highest; January 13).

As difficult as it is for many of us to accept and practice we need to learn the truth that God works most effectively in si-

lence. We are a culture that is overwhelmed with busyness and muchness. We cannot abide the sound of silence - it is alien to that lifestyle to which we have become accustomed. Telephones and television demand all our attention and there is little or no room for the "gentle whisper" of God's voice.

When Jesus was training the Twelve for their mission he did so by creating times of quiet to allow for teaching and reflection. Following the presentation of the parable of the sower and the seed in Mark four (see also Matthew 13:36) Jesus was only able to explain the parable when he got the disciples alone.

Not only did Jesus need solitude to teach, but Jesus also needed times of seclusion with the Father to strengthen himself for the task at hand. "...he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone" (Matthew 14:23). "Once when Jesus was praying alone..." (Luke 9:18).

When is the last time that you were alone with God? We find ourselves frustrated over what appears to be God's distance. We quickly become disenchanted and disappointed when we don't receive an immediate answer to our prayers. We may have become so disillusioned by God's lack of response that we have given up on prayer altogether.

Here's a suggestion: rather than "give up" something for Lent add something each of the forty days of Lent. Add some "alone" time with God. We find time to do other things; how about a few minutes at the start or close of the day to sit with God. It's okay to turn off the cell phone or the television and quietly say, "Speak, for your servant is listening" (1 Samuel 3:10). Give yourself permission to "do nothing" but sit quietly in the presence of god. Close your eyes take a few deep breaths and shut out the sounds around

you. God has something to share with you and God will only speak when we allow Him the opportunity. There is a time to speak and a time to be silent. God speaks loudest when we are quiet.

I see the passion our youth group has when talking about this event and we all know that it would not be possible for us to participate in this mission and ministry opportunity without the help and support of our church family. Throughout the upcoming months you will be given information on how you can help us make TeenServe 2016 a reality for the First Baptist Youth!

Have you ever wondered what a typical day looks like for the youth of a TeenServe work camp? TeenServe work campers are housed in schools prawhich serve as a 'home base' for all group activities. The campers are divided into groups of six which are called 'crews'. Every morning after breakfast each teen meets with his or her crew and travels to the home where they will be working. After a day spent blessing a family in need with their time, talents and service, the teens will head back to the school where each night there is a youth conference style program in the school gym. The evening begins with viewing pictures taken throughout the day and sharing stories of the day's events and then a rocking worship band and a national youth speaker round off the evening in praise and worship. It's difficult to say which part of the day is most impactful!

Our Financial Report

General Fund 1/1/2015	(\$2,304)

General Fund Expense	(\$241,919)
General Fund 12/31/2015	(\$5,829)

The general fund finished 2015 with a slight deficit of \$5,829 after starting the year with a \$2,304 deficit. The deficit increase (\$3,525) reflects a weekly shortfall of only \$67 and just small increase in giving of \$125/week in 2016 would eliminate the total 2015 deficit.

While the general fund may have struggle a little in 2015, through your generous support the Church had another strong year supporting various missions and ministries. For 2015, approximately \$65,000, or 17.8%, of all giving received went to support general missions and other ministries such as One Great Hour of Sharing, the World Mission Offing, America for Christ, Jubilee Christmas, ABK, Teen Serve, and the Food Pantry.

As we move into the New Year I encourage everyone to reflect on the previous year and look to 2016 with renewed enthusiasm and excitement for the great things God has in store for us this year. Through your continued giving and support I am sure that 2016 will be just as successful as 2015.
