As pastor and congregation, we have been together for almost thirty years. As we approach that milestone, I have something on my heart that I want to share with you. It is the simple phrase “thank you”. Thank you for your patience and understanding. Thank you for your love and support. Thank you for always stepping up when there is a call for help. I am always awed by your willingness to pitch in and do whatever needs to be done. I am proud and impressed with your passion for mission and outreach. We do family well. This is a good church.

When Pastor Jay and I outlined our vision for the coming year and beyond, one of the emphases of that vision is the call to be a more praying church. It is impossible to over stress the importance of prayer in our faith walk. As disciples of Jesus Christ everything we do is informed and directed by prayer. When we gather for corporate worship the music, readings, and message are all undergirded and planned with prayer. The writer to the Hebrews declares, without faith it is impossible to please God, (Hebrews 11:6). I don’t believe it is too much of a stretch to say that without prayer we cannot have faith; the discipline of prayer strengthens faith. The partnership of prayer and faith leads us to greater works.

At our annual congregational meeting in December we reviewed some sobering facts as we discussed significant declines in participation in both worship and Sunday Morning Connections. I want to emphasize that statistics do not define who we are as the people of God. Our ministry and mission are not characterized by lines on a graph. However, the numbers do challenge us to discern where God is leading us in ministry. The command of Jesus is to make disciples (Matthew 28:19). It stands to reason therefore, that to make disciples we need to be reaching out beyond the walls of the building into the community with the story of Jesus.

We claim that we want to Grow the Family of God. If that is our intention, then we must be a praying church. A praying church does not rush heedlessly into a plethora of programs simply for the sake of programming. Rather, a praying church takes the time necessary to pray for God’s direction in the planning and execution of ministries. Doing more is not necessarily doing God’s will. Jesus spent three years training the Twelve to do ministry. It’s ok to take time to discern God’s will. Before any great revival or awakening God’s people were committed to praying for renewal. If we are concerned about declining participation the first step in stemming that downward spiral is prayer, prayer, and more prayer. God will work when we are totally commit-

ted to giving our ministries to the One in whose name we pray.

I want to make two suggestions:

First, commit to a personal prayer covenant.

As part of my personal commitment to discipleship I will pray not less than fifteen (15) minutes twice a day for the ministries of First Baptist Church.

Specifically, I will pray for the following ministries:

- That God will lead persons to our church who need a relationship with Jesus Christ.
- That I will be bold in inviting and welcoming persons to our church family.
- That I will pray for opportunities to share my faith.
- That I will practice personal devotions.
- That I will pray for the pastors and others who share in leadership.
- That I will make a personal commitment to a small group.
- That I will find and join a Prayer Partner with whom I can meet regularly for mutual support and accountability.

Second, commit to a prayer partner. There is great strength and joy in the practice of meeting with another person once a week, or as often as possible, to share life's experiences and to pray for one another. Bonds of friendship are formed with a prayer partner that extend beyond the boundaries of time and location. Praying specifically for the joys and concerns of a prayer partner is exhilarating and renewing.

We are a good church. Good is the enemy of best. To be the best that God is calling us to be demands a commitment to pray. Paul commanded the Ephesians to pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. (Ephesians 6:18).

Due to malfunctions in the keypad entry system at the front entrance to the church the keypad has been replaced with a card security system. TOWARD JERUSALEM

Ash Wednesday is February 26 and as is our practice, we will conduct three services that day, 6:30 am, 12 noon, and 6:30 pm. Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the 40-day period of prayer, fasting, and meditation leading to Easter. The 40-day period is based on the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness temptation. It is important individually and corporately as we strive for personal and corporate spiritual renewal.

As we journey through Lent you are encouraged to participate in a Bible study titled "Toward Jerusalem". The booklet will be available for you on Sunday February 23. This devotional booklet contains meditations and scriptural suggestions to guide you on your journey into spiritual transformation. This journey may be taken individually or with your prayer partner. Ideally, you will have already done the work before meeting with your prayer partner. If you do not have a prayer partner, I want to encourage you in the strongest possible terms to invite someone to join you in prayer through this journey. Lent presents a wonderful opportunity to build a strong relationship through prayer with another person. Let me offer the following suggestions for finding a prayer partner:

- Pray for direction in selecting a prayer partner. Invite that one to join you in a mutual prayer journey.
- Meet regularly. Once per week is preferable. You may meet in person or by phone.
- Share what is happening in your life, at work or at home. Joys and concerns.
- *Maintain absolute confidentiality.*
- At the close of each session ask the question, "How can I pray for you?" As you become comfortable pray aloud for each other.

As you meet claim the promise of Matthew 18:20: *For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.* Try it for 40 days. You will discover that praying with another person is transformational, for you, and for our community of faith.
