It may be hard to realize, but the season of Lent is upon us. Ash Wednesday is coffee with jin February 17 and Easter April 4. Lent challenges us to reflect on our lives and experiences. It is a season in the calendar of the church that is designed to be a time for spiritual introspection. Lent begins with a smear of ash on the forehead. The symbol of the ash is to remind us of our mortality. The ashes are imposed with either the words, "Repent and believe the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." Which ever phrase

is used the point is still the same. We are members of fallen humanity in need of repentance, forgiveness, and reconciliation with God and with one another.

I'm fully aware of the fact that not everyone chooses to participate in Ash Wednesday. Regardless of whether we have a bit of ash on our forehead or not the call to reflection and repentance is still essential to our personal spiritual development and crucial to the life of the community of faith. It is easy to become a Christian. One confesses sin and accepts Christ. This is followed by baptism and membership in the Christian community. It occurs to me that perhaps it should be more difficult to join a church. It has become too easy to remove the cross and discipleship from the equation. Lent reminds us that we need to think critically about the decision we are making.

The requirement that Jesus laid down for discipleship was radical allegiance. Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Luke 14:26-28.

The forty days of Lent challenge each of us to estimate the cost of carrying the cross. We too readily give glib verbiage to our faith but fail miserably when it comes to practice. It is shamefully easy to lift our hands to heaven when we sing praise songs, or hold out holy hands in prayer, while spitefully gossiping about a sister or brother. We are hopelessly lost if we think God does not hold us accountable for those hate-filled words we utter against one another.

We need the season of Lent to remind us of the cost of carrying the cross. The words of Dietrich Bonhoeffer sting us if we are bold enough to apply them to our life. "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die."

This death is more than physical. It is death to self. It is death to the "what about me?" attitude that permeates so much of our lives and relationships. Dying in Christ is laying down my right to myself in order that Christ may live in me.

Yes, it is just a small patch of ash on the forehead, but it calls us to reflection, repentance, reconciliation, and renewal. As we receive the ashes it is with this prayer:

Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth: Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, that we may remember that it is only by your gracious gift that we are given everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.
