should have been said or should not have been spoken. It is a day to complain about the singing or the responsive reading. Attendance was low. If I was just a better preacher more people would attend church. If ... if ... if. The reality however, is that the benediction has been pronounced, the lights turned off, and we find ourselves facing the challenge of doing the same thing next week.

Someone who knows this pastor well recently shared a quote from American humorist Will Rogers, "Don't let yesterday use up too much of today." The quote sparked some serious reflection on those Monday postmortems. I wonder how much time I have wasted bemoaning what should have or could have been.

Someone far wiser than Will Rogers once suggested, "Do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today" (Matthew 6:34.) The same is true for yesterday. The analysis, dissection, and second guessing cannot change the past. We can learn from previous mistakes and successes, but we do not live there.

God doesn't look at us and record our failures. Rather, God gives us a clean slate and a new opportunity each and every day. We look back to our own detriment; focusing on the "what ifs," the "couldas" and the "shouldas."

Each sunrise is God's way of announcing, "Don't fret over what you cannot change. Let's do this together."
