March 15, 2020 was the last time we gathered for corporate worship without any form of restriction due to the pandemic. It has been a long struggle to find our way back into some sense of worship which is comfortable and familiar. In a sense, we have found ourselves in a strange, alien land, not unlike the children of Israel, in forced exile in Persia.

Regardless of the external circumstances in which we find ourselves we are still the children of God. The church is there through the act of God and has not been made by human beings (Dietrich Bonhoeffer). We claim the Spirit and power of God as we move forward in ministry.

The Old Testament book of Esther relates the story of God working in human events to save the lives of the chosen people. Although God is never mentioned in the book of Esther, God is powerfully present in placing Esther in a position of power where she is given the opportunity to save her people from genocide. When fear causes her to hesitate her cousin Mordecai challenges her with the words, “Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this.” Esther 4:14

The mission of the church has not changed. The Church exists to be the visible presence of God in the world. The Board of Ministries has adopted the logo you see above and a new tag line, “For such a time as this. . .”

You will quickly note that the points are the same as our existing tag line, “Growing the Family of God” with the addition of the words committed to prayer.

Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. (Philippians 4:6)

We are not attempting to change the nature and mission of the church, but rather to acknowledge and live into the reality that there is an urgency to our mission. We need to be passionately committed to telling the story of Christ’s sacrifice for the world, nurturing persons into discipleship, serving the church community and the neighborhood and to wrap our ministry in constant prayer. There was a definite sense of urgency when Mordecai approached Esther and there is a sense of urgency for the message of Christ in our world “For such a time as this. . .”

The words encircle the praying hands to indicate both overlapping and interrelatedness. This is not a four-step process but is an ongoing commitment to incarnate each of these actions in our personal lives and our corporate ministry.


The hands are not closed in prayer, but rather open to receive what the Spirit says to the church.

The Board of Ministries met on Thursday, April 8th at 7:00 pm.

Diaconate Council: Discussing what it means to be a welcoming church and reviewing the role of diaconate with new members.

Implementing new strategies for reaching out to our members who are homebound or in nursing homes.

Fellowship: We served 32 families representing 96 individuals in our food pantry during the month of March. We are also distributing \$10 gift certificates for the County Market meat department to food pantry patrons.

Moderator: We are providing a vital community service by allowing the Livingston County Health Department to conduct Covid-19 vaccination clinics at our church.
