Mark records that after Jesus selected the twelve disciples he went home. (Mark 3:19). Home for Jesus was the little town of Capernaum, a fishing village located on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee. It had a population of about 1,500.

Board of Ministries

The Board of Ministries met on Thursday, October 14, 2021 at 7:00 pm.

Diaconate: Planning to send cards and possibly flowers to shut-ins for Christmas.

Children's Ministries: All children's programming has resumed with an average attendance of 6 children during ABK.

Fellowship: Average attendance in Sunday Morning Connections has been 34. The food pantry served 35 families representing 105 individuals. We served 80 people at the meal following the outdoor service.

Moderator: Mark Eppel is still having issues getting supplies and workers to work on our parking lot. He is hopeful that the issues will be resolved and he will be able to begin work before winter.

Associate Pastor: We appreciate the help of our volunteers during our Friday night open gym and other activities. We're averaging 4 high school students on Wednesday nights and 6 junior high students.

Senior Pastor: Wednesday open prayer time is still going well. Jubilee Christmas will be hosted this year by the First Presbyterian Church on December 11th. A Congregational meeting will be scheduled for Sunday, December 12th immediately following morning worship.
